


**Fund objective**

**Portfolio manager**

Rory Spangenberg joined Northstar in January 2017 as an analyst, with a focus on global research and investments. Rory joined Northstar from SignalHill Investment Management, where he was the managing director and portfolio manager.

Prior to forming SignalHill, Rory spent 10 years with Investec managing value and income growth strategies. Experience prior to that includes: heading the South African research sales desk at Investec, London; research sales for Barnard Jacobs Mellet; and equity portfolio manager of the Sasol Pension Fund.

**Portfolio manager monthly comment**

The Northstar Global Flexible Fund returned 0.08% during August, marking the ninth straight month of positive returns for the portfolio manager’s strategy.

Global equity, as represented by the MSCI World Index, returned 0.14% extending its positive return streak to 10 months. Bond investors had a little more reason to cheer, with the Barclays Global Aggregate Index returning 0.99% during the month. Bond returns have, however, been a little more patchy delivering negative returns in 4 of the past 11 months.

Cyclical areas of the market remained in vogue, with the Technology (+3.07%) and Material (+2.05%) sectors delivering strong returns over the past month. The Energy (-3.25%) sector, however, bucked this trend, whilst underperformance in the Consumer Staples (-0.13%) and Discretionary (-1.01%) sectors persisted. The fund’s relative performance owes mostly to our growing cash pile (35% at month end), lack of any exposure to bonds, as well as the generally defensive nature of our equity selection.

Berkshire Hathaway (+21bps), Gilead Sciences (24bps) and LVMH Moet Hennessy (+21bps) contributed positively to returns during the month, whilst WPP plc (-57bps), Medtronic plc (-29bps) and Dunkin Brands (-21bps) were the detractors.

Gilead’s performance is particularly pleasing as it resulted, largely, from a decision to acquire Kite Pharma (\$12bn), an oncology immunotherapy specialist. Our positive view of Gilead’s shares, which, prior to the 30% rally over the past 3 months, traded on a forward free cash flow yield of 13%, was premised on an expectation that it’s robust cash generation afforded the company the ability to replace declining sales in its Hepatitis and HIV franchises through acquisition. In the absence of any such opportunity, we expected the company would announce a large share repurchase program.

During the month we sold the Fund’s holding in Altria, investing the proceeds in British America Tobacco (BAT). We feel an investment in BAT offers a better balance between the profitability of the US market and growth from its emerging markets franchise, which constitutes 60% of volumes. Following its merger with Reynolds, BAT is expected to show strong EBIT margin expansion, while free cash flow per share should double by 2020. Despite this, the share trades at just 16x 2017 earnings which is a 15% discount to its Tobacco sector peers and at the highest discount to European Staples in over 15 years.

## Glossary Terms

### Annualised total returns

Annualised return is the weighted average compound growth rate over the period measured.

### Capital growth

Capital growth is the profit made on an investment, measured by the increase in its market value over the invested amount or cost price. It is also called capital appreciation.

### Equities

Equities are shares that represent an institution's or individual's ownership in a listed company. These shares are also the "vehicle" through which they are able to "share" in the profits made by that company. As the company grows, and the expectation of improved profits increases, the market price of the share will increase which translates into a capital gain for the shareholder. Similarly, negative sentiment about the company will result in the share price falling.

Shares / equities are usually considered to have the potential for the highest return of all the investment classes but also have the highest level of risk i.e. share investments have the most volatile returns over the short term. An investment in equities should be viewed with a 7 to 10 year horizon.

### Undervalued equity stocks (Value investing approach)

This is a strategy of selecting shares that trade for less than their intrinsic values. Value investors actively seek stocks that they believe the market has undervalued. They believe the market overreacts to good and bad news, resulting in stock price movements that do not correspond with the company's actual long-term fundamentals. The result is an opportunity for value investors to profit by buying when the price is deflated.

### Securities

A general term for shares, bonds, money market instruments and debentures.

### Collective investment scheme (CIS)

Collective investment schemes (also called unit trusts) are portfolios of assets such as equities, bonds, cash and listed property, in which investors can buy units. They allow private investors to pool their money together into a single fund, thus spreading their risk across a range of investments, getting the benefit of professional fund management, and reducing their costs.

### Total Expense Ratio (TER)

This is the total costs associated with managing and operating an investment (administration, financial planning and servicing fees). These costs consist primarily of management fees and additional expenses such as trading fees, legal fees, auditor fees and other operational expenses. The total cost of the fund is divided by the fund's total assets under management to arrive at a percentage amount, which represents the TER.

### Standard deviation

Standard deviation (also called monthly volatility) is a measure of how much returns on an investment change from month to month. It is typically used by investors to gauge the amount of expected volatility in an investment.
